Chairman Waldorf called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM with all reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Committee Reports: ALASD had sent a letter to their customers outlying the issues facing them in regard to the MPCA permit for Lake Winona.


AAEDC: they will be holding a meeting for all township/city official members on October 25th from 7:30-9 AM.
