Cluttered property

Carlos Township is a beautiful place to live, unless you live next to a property which is unkempt with old cars, personal property, and in general a cluttered mess. Emergency Siren

Carlos Township installed an emergency siren. It is located off of County Road 11 by Circle Drive.

Township Roads

Seal Coating

The township will be seal coating Terrace Drive, Woodsmen Drive, Hidden Oaks and Prairie Road from East Lake Carlos Drive to CR42 this summer.

Miltona Carlos Bridge

The county installed a new culvert over the Long Prairie River last summer. The road will be paved from the bridge to CR13.

Ida Pines

The township is in the process of having this road paved this summer. A final assessment hearing will be held once all bills have been received.

South Lake Miltona Sewer District

The township created a subordinate sewer district for 18 property owners on South Lake Miltona Drive. These property owners have contracted with a private company to install a cluster system. Once completed the township will take over the maintenance of this project.

Buckskin Road East and Carlos Timbers West

Sections of these roads were impassable last year. The township cleaned out the ditches and installed culverts which provided better drainage to keep the water off the road.

Carlos Timbers East

The township approved to move forward and have this road paved this summer/fall. A final assessment hearing will be held once all bills have been received.

Chloride application:

Certain roads in the township will have received Calcium Chloride by the time of this printing. The remaining roads will be completed in early July.

Road Maintenance/Brushing Concerns from residents

All work orders need to be directed from the board to the township's road maintainer. If any resident has a concern or question regarding road maintenance, please contact a board member and they will contact the road maintainer.

Road Tour Inspection

The town board conducted the annual road inspection in April. The township's road maintainer R&R Ready Mix will be addressing issues of adding gravel, blading and brushing.

Primary Election

The township will be holding the Primary Election on Tuesday, August 14th. Polls will be open from 7:00 AM – 8:00 PM at the Carlos Town, 210 Victoria Avenue in Carlos.
