CARLOS TOWN BOARD  
June 23, 2022 - Carlos Town Hall  
Regular Meeting

Board Members attending: Supervisors Rod Meyers, Bill Krivanek, Dwayne Waldorf along with Clerk Rebecca Anderson.

Guest attending: None.

Chairman Meyers called the regular meeting to order at 7:00 PM with all reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Dwayne Waldorf moved to approve the minutes from June 9, 2022 as corrected. Bill Krivanek seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Road Issues: Steve Solum, resident of North Riverview addressed the board in regard to when the gravel roads will have calcium chloride applied. This road gets high traffic counts during the summer months due to tubers on the Long Prairie River. Mr. Solum had called Supervisor Waldorf, in which he was told the board prefers to use local operators vs contracting with the county. The reason is, if the county does the work, that contractor is gone and will not come back. Therefore, if the township contracts with someone local, he can come back and add more if needed. Mr. Solum would like for the township to have a completion date stated when using an operator. Bill Krivanek suggested to obtain a list of applicators to get quotes in January or February, and to have the application completed by Memorial Day.

Zoning: Nothing to report

Committee Reports: Bill Krivanek attended a Service Region Meeting. The region would like to have a feasibility study done to add areas within the district. There are 5 different areas in Carlos Township, Sandhill Lane, Sandhill Terrace; Woodsmen, Carlos Timbers, Hidden Oaks and the southern have of Ida Pines. There are a couple areas in Alexandria and LaGrand, but nothing in Hudson Township. They will be meeting again in September to go over these estimates. The McClellan property is being built on Sandhill Lane and the township would like for them to connect to ALASD as it is very close to the lake.

Chairman Meyers sent out 7 notices for noxious weeds.

Old Business: Bill Krivanek will contact Seph Construction to get a phone number for Mr. Mattson, who owns the property by the channel on East Lake Carlos Drive. Mr. Mattson would like to put in a pipe and cover it with black dirt. The township would need to make sure they have a handle on this ditch, as if it gets filled, it will be a problem. Mr. Mattson will need to work with Jerry Haggenmiller, the DNR and himself.

The clerk had spoken with the two residents that have property on Sandhill Terrace. Both of them are denying they placed wood in the ROW. The township will have R&R clean up the dead end where the trees are in the ROW.

The clerk is to order a curve sign to the right for Pike Road, along with Buckskin and Harmony Hills.

Road Issues: Dwayne Waldorf still needs to look at Fred Kollman's property on Park Lane. South Park Drive needs a pot hole fixed at 9134. The board will have Alden Just take care of this.

R&R's goal is to get the first pass of mowing completed by July 4<sup>th</sup>.

The board reviewed the newsletter draft. This will be printed and distributed by the July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend.


Jeff Stabnow will be working on a cost summary for the east end of ELCD from East Lake Carlos Lane to the dead end.


