

CARLOS TOWN BOARD
 August 28, 2025 - Carlos Town Hall
 Regular Meeting

Board Members attending: Supervisors, Rod Meyers, Dwayne Waldorf, and Bill Krivanek along with Clerk, Rebecca Anderson.

Guest attending: Stan Kleinhuizen.

Chairman Meyers called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM with all reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Bill Krivanek moved to approve the minutes of August 14th as printed. Dwayne Waldorf seconded the motion which carried.

Stan Kleinhuizen was wondering if the township will be maintaining the frontage road by North Riverview. Yes, the township will be maintaining it for now removal, etc.

Zoning: Dwayne Waldorf attended the hearing with regard to the Hintermeister application for a gravel pit. The zoning board approved the CUP, however there were a few residents opposed to the application that attended the hearing. The clerk had received a call in which she had the resident contact a supervisor. The question was what type of road Prairie Road is. Dwayne Waldorf indicated it is a 7 ton road. Mr. Hintermeister will be responsible for keeping the road clean and if there happens to be damage, he will be responsible for the costs of repairs.

Committee Reports:

Fire Hall. The next meeting is scheduled for September 8th. At the last meeting in July, no one from the building committee attended. Bill Krivanek met with Jeff Karrow and Marty Schultz who are the Alexandria Fire Chief and City Manager respectively. Bill Krivanek received information from a resident on Old County Road 120 indicating he was representing many people would like to change their fire district from The City of Carlos to the City of Alexandria. After speaking with fire chiefs from both municipalities, he found out the response time from both departments were very close to same timing. The Carlos Township Board is not in favor of moving districts around as this will set a bad precedence.

Special Meeting for Addition^{al} Levy to be held September 4th: This will be conducted the same as an annual meeting.



South Lake Miliona Sewer District: Bill Krivanek prepared the new amendment, based on comments and considerations held at the annual audit on August 27, 2025. He will send this to the advisory group and have it reviewed before approval by the township board. This will be on the agenda for the September 11, 2025 meeting.

Road issues: the North Riverview sign was installed, and Bill Krivanek will contact R&R to reiterate that the board does not need a third mowing, along with holding off on cutting down the cottonwood tree on Bay Lane. The board wants to confirm it is indeed in the township ROW.

There being no other business, Bill Krivanek moved to adjourn at 8:33 PM. Dwayne Waldorf seconded the motion and it carried.
