Regular Meeting

Board Members attending: Supervisors, Rod Meyers, Dwayne Waldorf, and Bill Krivanek and Clerk, Rebecca Anderson.

Guest attending: Brad Nyberg and Mike Swensrud.

Chairman Meyers called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM with all reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Dwayne Waldorf moved to approve the minutes of February 12, 2026 as printed. Bill Krivanek seconded the motion that carried unanimously.

Bill Krivanek moved to approve the minutes from the Board of audit held February 19, 2026 as printed. Dwayne Waldorf seconded the motion that carried unanimously.

Zoning; The Central Lakes ^{application} application was approved and has moved forward to the county commissioners.

Committee Reports: JPA: Bill Krivanek received a call from Jason Murfy indicating the most money that could be spent without obtaining a referendum is \$2,444,000 million. However, with the new design, it is estimated to be \$2.7 million which would call for a referendum that would be held on the November 2, 2026 General Election. This new design has space for 10 trucks and a wash bay, which will cost \$136,500.

The Board set the levy request for the Revenue and Road and Bridge funds along with the levy for the new design for the fire hall.

The clerk is to print 200 copies of the documents for the annual meeting.




No building permits to review.
