

CARLOS TOWN BOARD
June 11, 2026 - Carlos Town Hall
Regular Meeting

Board Members attending: Supervisors, Rod Meyers, Dwayne Waldorf, and Bill Krivanek along with Clerk, Rebecca Anderson and Treasurer, Tammy Schwegel.

Guest attending: David Kjos.

Chairman Meyers called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM with all reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Dwayne Waldorf moved to approve the minutes of May 28th as corrected. Bill Krivanek seconded the motion that carried unanimously.

Road Issues: R&R will begin working on the ditch issue for Rue de Frenchman along with the potholes on Old CR 120. R&R needs to be careful in trimming trees along Old CR 120 as one resident is not willing to work with the township with extending the right of way onto that property. There were many trees blown down due to the storm on Wednesday morning.

Bill Krivanek moved to pay R&R their bill for June. Dwayne Waldorf seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Zoning: Bill Krivanek will attend the viewing scheduled for tomorrow.

Committee Reports: Dwayne Waldorf gave a brief report on ALASD, Bill Krivanek indicated the ALASR meeting was cancelled again.

JPA: Fire Hall – Bill Krivanek received correspondence from Jason Murray. At the latest JPA meeting it was decided to place the approval of the expenditure for building the fire hall on the ballot to be held at the November General Election. The JPA lawyer will write the question to be placed on the ballot. If the vote passes, funding would be available within 60 days and construction could begin directly after the election.

Dave Kjos asked when information will be addressed to township voters. Bill Krivanek indicated bids will be received by August 10, 2026. The board would then have 84 days to get information out to the public. The board would have an information meeting, radio ads, etc. Mr. Kjos felt that a few questions that need to be answered are: What is the history of fire calls and what would the cost be for a property owner based on their market value?

Dwayne Waldorf moved to combine the Cities of Carlos and Alexandria fire levies into one, which would then be assessed to all property owners in Carlos Township. Chairman Meyers seconded the motion. On a voice vote, Waldorf and Meyers voted yes, with Krivanek voting no. The motion carried.

Weeds: Alden Just will spray thistles on Prairie Road and the Parsnips on Johnson Road. Chairman Meyers will speak to R&R about mowing thistles on Peaceful Lane.

Other old business: Dave Rush emailed the board in regard to not being able to get the board the changes for the South Lake Miltona Sewer District amendment. The clerk will let Mr. Rush know the board would like to have Mr. Rush finish this project.

There is a meeting with commissioners regarding Pike Road on June 16th. Dwayne Waldorf will attend this meeting.

Road Issues: Dwayne Waldorf spoke with Stennes Construction to get a quote to place a culvert on Miltona Carlos Road.

Alden Just is aware he is to apply calcium chloride and will coordinate timing with R&R.

Treasurer's report: Tammy Schwegel presented the financial report for the month ending May 31, 2026. Dwayne Waldorf moved to approve the report as presented. Bill Krivanek seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

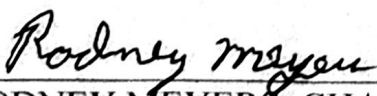

Building permits were reviewed.

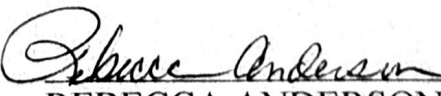
The clerk indicated election judge training will be June 24th and 25th. Candidate filing for the November election is July 14th through 5:00 PM on July 28th.
