

CARLOS TOWN BOARD
June 25, 2026 - Carlos Town Hall
Regular Meeting

Board Members attending: Supervisors, Rod Meyers, Dwayne Waldorf, and Bill Krivanek along with Clerk, Rebecca Anderson.

Guest attending: None.

Chairman Meyers called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM with all reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Bill Krivanek moved to approve the minutes of June 11, 2026 as printed. Dwayne Waldorf seconded the motion that carried unanimously.

Zoning: Bill Krivanek attended the viewing for the Eidsvold property. The new owner is building a shed and wanted a variance - as he did not want to hook up to ALASD. There will be no holding tank, or any other onsite septic for the shed. If one is installed, the owner will be required to connect to ALASD. The other viewing was for a resident on State Hwy 29 as he is purchasing a commercial building and may have some outside storage.

Dwayne Waldorf will attend the four viewing on July 2nd.

Committee Reports: Bill Krivanek received a call from Jack Anderson, advisory member for the South Lake Miltona Sewer District, looking for an update for the amendment. Dave Rush is working on it.

No ALASD or ALASR meeting.

Fire Hall: Bids will be submitted to the JPA on August 3rd. Even though the township is looking to offer the question on the November Election ballot, a resolution is required. The township is looking to be represented by the City of Carlos attorney which would be dual consent.

Bill Krivanek moved to contact Greg Donahue to represent the township. Chairman Meyers seconded the motion to receive information on the Data Practices Act for the township. The motion carried unanimously.

Dwayne Waldorf moved to hire Fryberger Law Firm to write the question that will be placed on the November ballot. Chairman Meyers seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Bill Krivanek proposed to the JPA that the City of Carlos consider paying for the entire design. This will be discussed at the City Council meeting.

No other old business.

Road Issues: The Township received a letter from a resident on Park Lane and a call from a resident on North Riverview regarding dead trees in the ROW's that need to be removed. The board will look at both areas to confirm if the trees are in the township's ROW.

Dwayne Waldorf met with the county commissioners to discuss the possible paving of Pike Road by the landfill. The county would like the township to contribute some monies toward the project. It was discussed that perhaps the county could take over the road, however, this discussion went nowhere. The county will be getting back to the township on this matter.

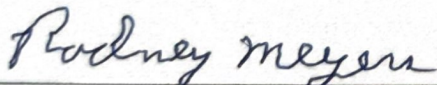
Road issues on Old CR 120 and Mount Carmel have been completed, however, there is a manhole on Mount Carmel that is still an issue.

Chairman Meyers spoke with Precision Roadway and if they have any questions the contractor will call him.

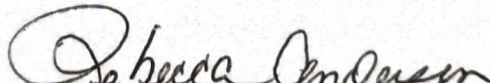
